**USE OF ENGLISH**

**QUESTION TAGS:** are the short questions added to the end of a statement, usually used to confirm or seek agreement.

**positive/negative**

If the main part of the sentence is **positive**, the question tag is negative ...

Examples:

- *He is a doctor, **isn't he?***
- *You work in a bank, **don't you?***

... and if the main part of the sentence is **negative**, the question tag is positive.

Examples:

- *You haven't met him, **have you?***
- *She isn't coming, **is she?***

## COMPOUND ADJECTIVES

A compound adjective is a combination of two or more words which can perform the role of an adjective in a sentence

Examples:

- We went for a **five-kilometer** walk in the park
- The Coliseum is a **world-famous** site in Rome.

half-asleep

good-tempered

well-known

ten-year-old

old-fashioned

good-looking
