Active Voice	Passive Voice
<p>Tells us what a person or thing does. The subject performs the action (Verb) on the object. Subject + Verb + Object Example: • Anna painted the house. • The teacher always answers the student's questions. • All posted the video online.</p>	<p>Tells us what is done to someone or something. The subject is being acted upon. Object + Verb + Subject Example: • The house was painted by Anna. • The student's questions are answered by the teacher. • The video was posted online by All</p>

We use a relative clause to give extra information about the nouns in the main clause, without starting another sentence.

The relative clause goes immediately after the noun it relates to.

The relative pronouns are:

WHO: it is used to talk about people

THAT: it is used to talk about objects, animals, places, plants, food ect...

Examples:

- It was Charles Darwin **who** made the Islands famous.
- The animal **that** is the best known of all is the Galapagos Tortoise.
